

FOR GCQ AREAS:

- MANDATE YOUNG (0 TO 20 YEARS OLD) AND SENIOR CITIZENS (60 AND UP), AND HIGH HEALTH RISK INDIVIDUALS TO STAY HOME
- **ALLOW NON-WORKERS TO GO OUT TO BUY GOODS** AND SERVICES **EXCEPT** THOSE PERTAINING TO SECTOR **CATEGORY IV (LEISURE AND KIDS)**
- ALLOW SOME PUBLIC TRANSPORT MODES TO OPERATE AT REDUCED CAPACITY
- LGUS TO ENFORCE CURFEW AT NIGHT FOR NON-WORKERS
- **ALLOW PRIORITY AND ESSENTIAL CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS** TO RESUME







FOR GCQ AREAS:

ALLOW RESTRICTED MALL OPENING COVERING NON-LEISURE SHOPS

Allow certain sections of malls to open:

a. Supermarkets

d. Laundry service

b. Drugstores

e. Restaurants for takeout or delivery only

c. Banks

f. Hardware

Allow only the following to enter:

 a. Age 21 to 59 (72% of mall-goers) with ID and not looking sickly

c. Mandatory wearing of masks d. Mandatory alcohol use

b. Mandatory temperature check

e. Limit the number of people inside the mall

Impose health standards:

- a. To avoid lingering, increase aircon temperature to 26 degrees and remove free wifi
- Mall operators or employers to provide masks and gloves to employees.







REOPENING OF OPERATIONS IN GCQ AREAS BY INDUSTRY

CATEGORY 1100% OPENING

- Agriculture, fishery, forestry
- Food manufacturing and its entire supply chain (including ink, packaging, raw materials, etc.)
- Food retail (supermarket, market, take-out, and delivery services only)
- Healthcare (hospitals, clinics, drug stores)

- Logistics
- Water
- Energy
- Internet, telecommunications
- Media





REOPENING OF OPERATIONS IN GCQ AREAS BY INDUSTRY

CATEGORY 2 50 - 100% OPENING

- Electronics and exports
- E-commerce and delivery for essential and non-essential items
- Repair and maintenance services
- Housing and office services





REOPENING OF OPERATIONS IN GCQ AREAS BY INDUSTRY

CATEGORY 3

50% ON SITE WORK 50%WORK FROM HOME

- Financial services
- · BPO
- Other non-leisure services
- Other non-leisure
 wholesale and retail trade





RESTRICTIONS ON OPERATIONS IN GCQ AREAS BY INDUSTRY

CATEGORY 4100% CLOSURE

- Schools (consider late opening in September at the earliest) except online learning
- Leisure, amusement, gaming, fitness
- "Kid" industry

- Tourism
- All gatherings, including religious, conferences, etc.
- Malls (limited opening)
- Construction (limited opening)



The IATF recommends these industries to be opened in September as part of measures to contain the spread of COVID-19 in the country.

INDUSTRIES AND OFFICES CONSIDERED FOR

SEPTEMBER OPENING

- Classes in schools (except online learning)
- Leisure, amusement, gaming and fitness
- Tourism
- All mass gatherings
 (including religious services, conferences)
- Limited opening of malls
- Limited opening of construction activities
